		<p>a) Jazzy plays the saxophone. She want to see some jazz concerts. She would also like to do a boat tour. It would be great if she could listen to some music and eat some nice food on the boat.</p>
		<p>b) Alejandro goes to a samba school in Rio. In New Orleans he wants to see their carnival. He wants to see their costumes and outfits. Maybe he can learn something. He also wants to see the New Orleans countryside.</p>
		<p>c) Alisha likes nature and animals. She would like to learn more about <u>endangered animals</u> (= bedrohte Tierarten). She would also like to have breakfast and look at the New Orleans street life.</p>
		<p>d) Jonathan is on holiday with his family. He and his wife would like to learn more about New Orleans history. His children want to see some animals. It would be great if they could <u>pet</u> (= streicheln) them!</p>
		<p>e) Zainab and her daughter are fascinated with the history of the city. They would like to see some <u>spooky</u> (= gruselig) places! In the evening they would like to enjoy the nightlife without any drinking and smoking.</p>

<p>Café du Monde</p> 	<p>A) This is the perfect place to start your day. They have the best beignet donuts and coffee in New Orleans.</p> <p>You can also watch street musicians, tarot readers and lots of other street life while you have your breakfast.</p>
<p>Natchez</p> 	<p>B) The boat trips along the Mississippi River on the Natchez are fantastic! You can see all the sights while relaxing and listening to some good jazz music. You can also eat a delicious meal right on board. Book your tickets now!</p>
<p>Cemeteries</p> 	<p>C) New Orleans <u>cemeteries</u> (= Friedhöfe) are also called "cities of the dead". The spooky sights are planned like a city.</p> <p>Some of the <u>graves</u> (= Gräber) are very beautiful.</p> <p>You might even recognise them from some movies!</p>
<p>Preservation Hall</p> 	<p>D) This is the place to come for some jazz concerts with your family. It has great live music, no smoking or drinking allowed!</p> <p>Every night people come together to listen to musicians in their 70s and 80s play some authentic New Orleans jazz.</p>
<p>Mardi Gras World</p> 	<p>E) Even if you don't want to see the carnival, you will not want to miss this. It is a huge warehouse full of costumes and floats.</p> <p>You can also see people making all the decorations for Mardi Gras. You can even dress up in some original costumes yourself!</p>
<p>Cajun Tour</p> 	<p>F) This is a tour with two parts:</p> <p>First, you will go to the <u>swamps</u> (= Sümpfe) and learn all about the alligators and other animals that live there. Then, you will see a slice of New Orleans history and visit a <u>plantation</u> (= Plantage).</p>
<p>Audubon Zoo</p> 	<p>G) More than 1300 animals live in the zoo, including a Komodo dragon, sea lions white tigers and white alligators.</p> <p>Extra tip: Be at the zoo at 3 pm sharp, that's when the alligators are fed!</p>
